### MAWSS Inducts Four into Employee Hall of Fame

Mobile Area Water & Sewer System (MAWSS) inducted four retirees into the Employee Hall of Fame, April 8, at MAWSS Park Forest Plaza.

Recognizing that dedicated, loyal employees are essential to the organization's success, MAWSS started the Employee Hall of Fame in 2009, to honor exceptional past employees who exhibited a strong work ethic, loyalty, attitude and dedication. The program encourages current employees to follow in their footsteps. This year's inductees were:

**Alfreda A. Bradley** retired from the Meter Reader Department as a Supervisor in November 2003, after twenty –five years of service.

**Dwight S. McGough** retired from MAWSS' Executive Staff in 2014, as Planning and Engineering Manager. In his 27 years at MAWSS, McGough believed in the power of positive employee recognition. As sponsor of the Employee Recognition Committee, he started several annual events including the Employee Hall of Fame.

**Janet F. Nichols** retired from MAWSS in 2007 after 24 years of service. She began her career in the Customer Service Department, before moving to the Accounting Department where she became the purchasing agent for MAWSS.

**Mary “Helen” Jackson** retired from the Purchasing Department at MAWSS in 1991 after 20 years of service. Before working at MAWSS, she was a volunteer with the American Red Cross. She returned to the volunteer organization when she retired and relocated to Greenville, S.C.

A total of 51 employees have been inducted into the MAWSS Employee Hall of Fame since the program started representing 1,541 years of service to the community. The honorees’ names were added to the Hall of Fame plaque displayed in the Wesley James Operations Center at MAWSS Park Forest Plaza.
