The Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners of the City of Mobile met this Monday in their regular session at 1:30 p.m. at MAWSS' Park Forest Plaza.

Chair Zoghby called the meeting to order and Commissioner Williams gave the invocation.

There were no Committee Reports or Visitors.

Mr. McCrory extended warm wishes and congratulations to MS. SHARON A. REED, Water Service Supervisor I, on her retirement after 46 years of service.

Chair Zoghby presented the Consent Agenda Items for approval, and they are as follows:

## Item 4 Consent Agenda

Commissioner Bell moved for approval of the **Consent Agenda**; Commissioner Williams seconded and the motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

Ms. Washington approached the Board with a presentation detailing recent updates and advancements that have been implemented in order to enhance customer experience.

- Springhill Payment Facility has been permanently closed as of March 31, 2023
- Retail Cash Payments (RCP) bar code retrieval can be made from the MAWSS water bill and online
- Accepted Payment Locations from anywhere in the U.S. (72,000 retailers)
- MAWSS Water Bill has been updated and streamlined for easier comprehension/better graphics
- Updated MAWSS website <u>www.mawss.com</u> is scheduled to go-live on June 15, 2023

She concluded her presentation and stated more features, including CHATnow are scheduled for late fall 2023.

The **Minutes of May 1, 2023** were presented for approval. Commissioner Bell moved for approval and Commissioner Drummond seconded. The motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

Legal was next and Attorney Dean stated there are two matters appropriate for discussion in an Executive Session.

There were no items of **Unfinished Business**.

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New Business was next and they are as follows:

## \*Late Agenda Item

There are *two pumps* at the *Stickney WWTP* which service the Hillcrest Road area and have been in service for more than 35 years. The pumps have been placed for bid with equipment delivery time estimated at 7-9 months. The bid is scheduled for Wednesday, June 7<sup>th</sup> and the cost of the new pumps is valued at \$175,000 - \$200,000 each.

Staff requests approval of Directors Award authorization once the bids are reviewed in order to expediate the process as one pump has already failed. At this time, the remaining pump is handling service, but replacement of both pumps has been deemed critical due to failure and age. The engineers estimate is \$350,000 - \$400,000 for both pumps; if the bid exceeds that amount, staff will bring the item back to the Board for additional authorization.

Commissioner Bell moved for approval and Commissioner Drummond seconded. The motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Board requested Attorney Dean research and provide clarification in regards to proper procedures/rules in regards to notification and addition of late items to the Board agenda.

## Item 8A Facilities for Acceptance – Longleaf Gates Phase II Water and Sewer Facilities

Mr. Russell presented this item to the Board for approval. The subdivision is located on the northside of Girby Road and contains 42 lots. Staff has reviewed all documentation and recommend acceptance. Commissioner Bell moved for approval; Commissioner Williams seconded and the motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

#### Item 8B Wells Fargo Bank Building Purchase Agreement

As discussed during previous Growth and Development/Infrastructure/Property Committee meetings, Mr. McCrory presented this agreement for approval. The anticipated use of the facility will be for the online correspondence staff, three drive-up kiosks and one walk-up kiosk. Commissioner Drummond moved for approval and Commissioner Bell seconded. The motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

# Item 8C Decentralized Wastewater Treatment Facilities (Hutchens and Snow Road) sale to South Alabama Utilities

As also discussed during previous Growth and Development/Infrastructure/Property Committee meetings, staff requests approval to move forward with the sale of the facilities as noted. Commissioner Williams moved for approval and Commissioner Gonzalez seconded. The motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.

## Item 8D Request Approval to Advertise Wholesale Sanitary Sewer Rate

The wholesale sanitary sewer rate is 63% of the current rate as established by the cost of service study. Staff requests approval to advertise for a thirty-day period. Commissioner Bell moved for approval and Commissioner St. John seconded. The motion then carried with the unanimous vote of the Board.
